- c. **Goal 3: Hold Offenders Accountable (Sheriff Ed Prieto, Undersheriff Tom Lopez)**
 - 1. Restorative process/option for victim and offenders
 - 2. Strengthen noticing through newspapers and other media
 - 3. Publicizing Arrests and Incarceration
 - 4. Support community service programs through jail crews and supervised community service
 - 5. Maintain a flexible supervision and jail system to reward good behavior change and sanction bad behavior
 - 6. Timely responses to crime so offender realizes consequences quickly
